TTN is now 4 years old! With your support, we've been able to accomplish many things and with your recent input on our Needs Assessment, we will continue to provide quality programming, all with the goal of developing a trauma-informed system of care in our community. One program I really want to highlight after issuing over 40 Trauma-Responsive Care certifications in June, is our Trauma-Responsive Care Certification program, a collaboration with Finding Hope Consulting, LLC. In last July's newsletter, I was excited to tell you that we had certified 67 professionals to date. **This July, I'm ecstatic that that number is now 144! More than double the total from last year.** This ultimately means better services for trauma survivors in our community. Something I know excites everyone reading this newsletter. Trauma-Responsive Care Certified professionals live and work in OH, KY, and IN. They work for a variety of agencies - 65 to be exact. They are therapists, case managers, social workers, consultants, private practitioners, clinical supervisors, direct support professionals, and school support professionals, all with a passion for understanding and working effectively with trauma survivors. We are so proud of the work they did to complete the series and the work they do every day to help others!

TTN's next TRCC Series will begin November 5, 2019 and run through May 2020.

Several agencies in the tristate have contracted with Finding Hope Consulting to provide training on-site for their staff. This is also an option that can lead to certification. In other trauma-informed care news, **five agencies are very close to completing their 12-month TTN Trauma-Informed Care Learning Community** in partnership with The National Council for Behavioral Health. On July 31, 2019, these 5 agencies: **Children Inc., Diocesan Catholic Children's Home, Goshen Local School District, Northern**

KY Community Action Commission, and Wilmington City Schools will join 23 other agencies that have completed TTN's Learning Community. They will continue to strive towards becoming more trauma-informed as they work to sustain their efforts. As data results come in, I can share that 3 of these 5 agencies have improved on all 7 domains of trauma-informed care assessed by the National Council's Organizational Self-Assessment. Way to go teams!

Around the same time, a new cohort - TTN's 4th one! - will embark upon the **2019-2020 TIC Learning Community** process. The participating agencies for the new cohort are:

Hamilton County Public Health
Mayerson Center for Safe and Healthy Children at Cincinnati Children's Hospital
Medical Center
Mental Health America of Northern Kentucky and Southwest Ohio Inc.**

With two agencies from the healthcare sector, we will be exploring trauma-informed care in healthcare settings for the first time. Stay tuned as we will definitely share lessons learned from this new endeavor.
